

GUIDELINES FOR ROTARIANS MAKING PRESENTATIONS

When making a presentation to a Rotary Club or District there are a number of guidelines to ensure Interplast displays a consistent and complete message so Interplast continues to meet the requirements as a signatory to the Australia Council for International Development Code of Conduct (ACFID), and also as an accredited NGO with AusAID.

Interplast will provide you with a Powerpoint Presentation for you to use as a base for your presentation. You can add or remove slides, and add and remove photos to personalise your presentation. Talking about a particular patient/family that touched your heart from your personal experience is always easier than just facts and figures.

We would like, when making your presentation, that you mention the following key points

- Interplast medical personnel are all qualified in their field of expertise and volunteer their time for Interplast (saving millions of dollars)
- Interplast volunteers change lives for the person who receives the operation and their family and community.
- Interplast conducts a variety of different activities to meet the needs of the country
- Every Interplast program is a training program leaving a legacy long after the volunteers have returned home
- Rotary Clubs and Districts do more than just fundraising, they are members of the company, board of directors and Rotarians Committee.

It is also very important that the photographs you choose to use are appropriate for presentation. Please read the photography policy and ensure your photos meet those guidelines. We also request that photographs that show blood, and those that could be considered 'confronting' are not used. When selecting your photos for your presentation please also be mindful most Rotary Club presentations also involve a meal at the meeting, so please err on the conservative side so as not to offend anyone sensitive to such material.
